Optional Extra Care Program

Note: extra care charges are billed separately after each month of usage has ended.

Required NON-REFUNDABLE Fees

Application fee \$100 one-time new students only
Enrollment fee (due upon acceptance) \$100 one-time new students only
Annual supply fee \$200 annually due with first mon

Annual supply fee \$200 annually due with first month's tuition payment

Deposit* \$345 (half-day) or \$496 (full-day)

- All fees and deposits can be made electronically via the FACTS portal during the application or enrollment process. This payment system will also be used for tuition payments.
- A 10% sibling discount is applied to the second child's tuition.
- ♦ 10-month tuition payment plan **first payment is due July 1**st; last payment is April 1st. One of the ten payments is split in half with the first half being paid as the deposit and the last payment being the remaining half.
- Payments for tuition are due on the 1st of each month; \$30 late fee charged after the 10th
- Full year payment must be received by July 1st to receive the 5% discount.
- Students beginning after the start of the school year will pay a prorated amount based on the full year's tuition. Paid in full discount of 5% applies to enrollments through September 30th.
- Enrollment is dependent upon availability the non-refundable waitlist fee of \$50 per child will be applied toward the \$100 enrollment fee. Please refer to the Enrollment Process and Waitlist Policy sheet for details.
- The withdrawal policy, including a tuition obligation schedule, is explained on the next page.

SMA is a non-profit/501(c)(3) registered as a non-public school in Indiana.

Tuition Obligation and Withdrawal Policy

SMA has an annual tuition. Parents must sign a tuition agreement, which explains in detail the terms of the tuition payments. Tuition is invoiced in June for the tuition amount plus any fees for the entire academic year. Either the first monthly payment or the one-time payment is due no later than July 1. Monthly tuition payments are due the first day of the month thereafter (starting August 1), and electronic payments can be automated through the FACTS Tuition Management portal, or in-person payment methods can be arranged. Tuition will not be adjusted due to illness, vacations, or school closure. In the event that parents choose to enroll in the optional extra care program, they will be billed separately for this program on a monthly basis.

There will be a late fee of \$30.00 for payments received by SMA after the tenth day of the month. Parents with tuition 30 days in arrears may be asked to withdraw the student at SMA's discretion. The parents agree to pay all costs of collection should outside services be required to collect overdue tuition amounts. Those costs may include, but are not limited to, a collection fee of 40%, attorney fees and court costs, for example.

In the event a student is withdrawn by the parents, the parents shall provide notice of said withdrawal in writing to the Head of School. The withdrawal date must be on or after the date at which Head of School receives the official withdrawal notice. The following schedule of tuition obligation is effective for the 2025-2026 school year based on the withdrawal date or last day of attendance, whichever date is most recent. All tuition deposits, enrollment fees, and supply fees are non-refundable.

Withdrawal Date/Last date of Attendance Tuition Obligation Owed

Prior to June 11	Tuition Deposit (equals 5% of total tuition)
June 11 to July 10	25% of tuition plus tuition deposit
July 11 to September 30	50% of tuition plus tuition deposit
October 1 to October 31	75% of tuition plus tuition deposit
November 1 and after	100% of tuition

If the parents have paid tuition in full, they will be refunded the amount remaining, if any, at the time of the official withdrawal notice. If the parents are on a monthly payment schedule, tuition balance owed shall be paid within 30 days of the withdrawal date, and any balance remaining after 30 days is subject to the collections process.

If the student is asked to withdraw at the request of SMA, the withdrawal shall take effect immediately and tuition shall be paid by the parents through the end of the month the withdrawal takes effect. No adjustments will be made for absences, school closures or delays.



Enrollment Process

Southwest Montessori Academy (SMA) does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, sex (including gender identity), nationality or ethnic origin, socio-economic level, physical ability or genetic information, or learning style in regard to admissions. Children must turn 3 years old before December 1st to enroll for the current school year.

Applications for the next school year may be submitted starting in September of the current school year. Priority consideration will be given to applications received by January 15th. Applications submitted after this date will still be considered, possibly for the waitlist. Enrollment placement for the next school year will be announced by the end of February.

To be considered for enrollment at SMA, parent(s) or legal guardians must:

- 1. Take a tour of Southwest Montessori Academy in person and/or via Zoom.
- 2. Submit the SMA application and pay the \$100 application fee.
- 3. Complete an in-person prospective student visit in the classroom. Once SMA determines that it is able to provide an education meeting the child's needs while accommodating the classroom's overall requirements, the parents or guardians will be offered enrollment (pending an available opening).
- 4. Accept the enrollment offer by completing the enrollment forms, submitting the \$100 enrollment fee, and paying the deposit within 5 business days. A signed tuition agreement will complete the enrollment process. Note, if a spot on the waitlist is offered instead, submit \$50 waitlist fee, which is credited towards toward the enrollment fee. See the waitlist policy on the next page for details.

SMA utilizes a third-party payment system called FACTS. Please refer to the annual tuition schedule for information regarding deposits, fees, tuition discounts and other details. The deposit is advance payment of half of a monthly tuition payment, with the other half being paid as the final tuition payment at the end of the school year. If tuition is paid in full, the deposit is credited toward the total amount due.

Below is a payment timeline summary (plus additional financial planning considerations).

Set up FACTS to pay enrollment fee and deposit; sign tuition agreement	Within 5 business days of enrollment offer
First tuition payment (OR pay tuition in full to receive 5% discount*) and supply fee	July 1st, or before student's first day if enrolled after July 1 *5% discount on late enrollments only through Sept. 30
Monthly tuition payment	1st of each month (before the 10th)
Re-enrollment steps for next year (for families eligible to re-enroll and/or for eligible incoming younger siblings)	February 10th (updated tuition for the next school year will be announced in December or January)
Final tuition payment (amount equal to deposit)	Either April or May (depending on enrollment date)
Summer camp tuition (limited availability, open only to returning or incoming families)	Payment in full due by May 1st

Waitlist Policy

A non-refundable waitlist fee of \$50 per child is required to wait for an enrollment spot to open. It will be applied to the enrollment fee if your child is offered enrollment. Paying the waitlist fee DOES NOT GUARANTEE ENROLLMENT. Enrollment is dependent on space availability.

If your child is offered enrollment at SMA from the waitlist, you will have five (5) business days to accept the offer. To accept the offer, you must pay a non-refundable deposit and any other fees owed to SMA's office or via our FACTS tuition payment system. The deposit is advance payment of half of a monthly tuition payment, with the other half being paid as the final tuition payment at the end of the school year. Failure to pay the fees and formally accept enrollment within 5 business days will result in forfeiture of the \$50 waitlist fee AND placement at SMA.

To be put on SMA's waitlist, parent(s) or legal guardians must have completed steps 1-3 in the enrollment process and pay the waitlist fee.

Additional enrollment considerations:

- If your child's age matches SMA's available spot
- If you are a returning family or alumni family
- If you were carried over from a previous school year's waitlist
- If your child has previous Montessori experience
- The date you submitted the application and fees
